HIGHLIGHTS

Childcare Program



This past year, we successfully completed three Spanish-speaking childcare cohorts, reaching 42 entrepreneurs and delivering roughly 15 hours of business training per cohort. Through individualized support and instruction, 86.7% of program participants were able to access capital through grants, resulting in \$139,500 in total capital to help launch or expand childcare businesses in our community.

Empresari@ Program



In 2025, the Empresari@ Program delivered a two-phase course model supporting entrepreneurs at different stages. "Qué Tan Listo Está?" helps participants assess market demand and business viability before making costly investments. "Acciones a un Emprendimiento Sostenible" focuses on building business plans and core skills to start or expand a business. Both courses use Dialogue Education to emphasize hands-on learning and practical application, to advance entrepreneurship in the community.
